That night at supper, I told of my troubles, and that I had to go to chorus practice at the hill church at 7:00 as we were only a week or two away from our spring concert. That was with Hubert Hendrie and Louise Didsbury, the first of many Wallkill Valley community concerts. That was when I met the (three Bob's) Bob Liebold, Bob Bernhart, and Bob Laurence, all of whom became very good friends. After practice we would go to Wallkill, buy ice cream, and go up in a peach orchard, eat our ice cream, and sing our heads off: no one could hear us.

Well, when I came out of the church, there sat my muddy old '32 Chevy right in front of the church. There was never a challenge that would stop my brother and Leo Orndorff. Bob Liebold, and Bob Bernhart were ushers at my wedding. ~Walt

He states that Frederick Douglass visited Walden at some point and gave a talk. During that visit, Frederick Douglass was the guest of the Levi Gowdy family on Oak Street.

At this time flourishing night schools were held during the winter months in Scofield Hall (Silver's Department Store) and tuition was paid for by the attending scholars... Many prominent men spoke. Among them were, Henry Ward Beecher, E. H. Chapin, Frederick Douglass, Horace Greely, and Francis Vinton. ~ Old Walden

We would like to locate the date of Frederick Douglass' visit. We know that Mr. Douglass gave an address on August 7, 1869 in Newburgh at Washington's Headquarters on the occasion of the 15th Amendment Jubilee. Possibly his visit to Walden was during the same trip, but further research is required!


